## Scholarship and Waiver Programs

The following university award programs require that the student enroll in 12 credits each semester and complete 24 graded credits by the end of the academic year, unless otherwise stated. Receipt of these awards will discontinue once the student receives their first bachelor's degree. Students should refer to their award letter or Student Financial Services staff for further conditions and eligibility. Student loses award if they become a Vet Med or Pharmacy student; unless participating in 7 year Honors Vet Med program or accelerated Vet Med program, before they achieve their Bachelors degree.

Students cannot receive multiple visitation awards, i.e. cannot attend both Future Cougars and Experience WSU and receive two awards.

WUE Cougar Award GPA requirement was grandfathered to all years of the award, including those titled Cougar Academic Award - students do not need 3.0 to renew.

Avalue = (GPA x 400) + SAT. SAT scores are for Evidence based reading/writing and Math only.
